saying would happen so, thank you.

Nancy Juetten: So nice to meet you.

Chris: Nice to meet you.

Chris: In the process of filling in all of the items that you had already identified, it also

brought up for us other important things that we could easily add. Yet the actual getting it together can be balanced out by having it fun and by having this colorful screen of the fireworks and all. That fun part,

light part, actually makes a big difference.

Nancy Juetten: Well, we're just beaming with pride to hear those comments because that's

really what we were hoping would be the outcome.

Michelle: Well, I really experienced it that way by having the part that was kind of

unconsciously bothering me, which wasn't the task, it was what might happen

that might give need to using this product. It really helped.

Nancy Juetten: Very, very good. Well, I know Amy is here and I'm wondering if we can hear

from Amy. Do you have any comments, Amy, that you'd like to share?

Amy: Oh, shoot. I had one and then I forgot. Oh, I know. It was super cool to have

your handholding. I think that I like the check in part, so how you get started and then we check in and stuff because it kind of appealed to that part of us

that likes to have approval.

Nancy Juetten: Mm-hmm (affirmative).

Amy: You know, like that ... the accountability. It helps so much. I mean, I have a lot

of this information in all the other places and everywhere and stuff but definitely getting it all secured and so that then my partner and I can talk about it after and then also having some of those conversations about the hairy-scary stuff is ... Yeah, it's good that we're going to be having those and yeah ... But I really super ... the accountability and the check in, that part, was

super great. Like that, just this call, has been really amazing for me.

Steve Juetten: So, here's something. I'm very task-oriented and tend to be very organized. Not

a surprise there. What we know from experience and from all the research is that if you have items on your to do list ... and I want to emphasize this time and again, in the next 48 hours you need to take action on at least one or two of those items. And here's why is that creates this momentum that you've already started, it continues the momentum. The other part is commit to trying to complete whatever it is you need to do within two weeks. From two weeks from today be complete with everything that you're doing. So whether you're live or whether you're listening to this, A) make sure you do something within 48 hours and 2) finish within two weeks. And if you're already done or close to done, review it within two weeks. There will be things that will come up that you'll go

back in and doing.

I'll give this real quick example for you. When Nancy and I first did this I did not have her life insurance policy number. Remember we couldn't find that anywhere? And I had forgotten about it but because we committed to coming back in two weeks it was like, "Oh, I forgot to do that." So I fired off a note to our insurance person and got the information.

The last item is I want you to think about reviewing this. We have on the slide here quarterly. That may be too much for you but a couple of times a year we need to review this because passwords change and information changes. Just as an example, if you add a car or you change policies or something. So at least twice a year try to do it. If you can do it quarterly good for you. That's more than I can do, I'll have to tell you. I'll have to admit that. Nancy's looking at me with

crossed eyes like, "Wait a minute. You're not doing it quarterly?" The idea here is take action. Finish what you're doing in two weeks and then review regularly.

Nancy Juetten:

Absolutely. I wanted to make a comment. I don't know if we mentioned this during the previous call but beneficiary designations absolutely need your important attention. In today's day and age where the modern family takes all kinds of shapes and sizes, where sometimes there's multiple spouses in a lifetime, make sure that if you're supposed to be the designated beneficiary that all the accounts where beneficiaries are noted show that you are, in fact, that person because we have heard interesting, dramatic tales from the road where wife number three was denied whatever the wealth that she was due because husband forgot to take wife number two off of the paperwork. Don't let that be your fate. Make sure your beneficiary designations are up to date.

I also wanted to comment on something that I think is important to bring about for all the folks who may be listening to this call subsequently. I don't know about you but I love being ahead of life before life happens because I know where things are, I can put my hands on what I want when I need it and I'm not in crisis. When people are in crisis they're dealing with something that was absolutely unexpected and quite unfortunate. Sometimes their rational ability to deal with things in a step-by-step manner is deeply compromised and there can be conflict and all kinds of collateral damage. The fact that it's a Saturday and you've given a few hours of your life to get this done and dialed is just a beautiful thing that you've done because if life does serve up a bump in the road you'll be able to be more present to whatever it is that has happened so that you can deal with it as best you can without as much drama, trauma or chaos.
